<u>Course Overview:</u> Latin I introduces students to the basics of the Latin language, primarily focusing on reading and grammar. Another important goal of the course is for students to learn about Ancient Roman culture. Instruction will typically take place in English, but as we progress, students should expect to receive increasing amounts of information in our target language, Latin.

Grades: Your final grade will be an average of the four quarters (20% each) and your final exam (20%) Grades will be broken down into skill areas:

- Reading Comprehension and Translation (30%)
- Culture/History/Mythology (10%)
- Vocabulary (30%)
- Grammar, Composition, and Speaking (30%)

Rules and Expectations:

- 1. Abide by all Northwest HS expectations for behavior.
